McNab swaps hard hats for pyjamas for kids in foster care

Staff at local construction company McNab swapped hard hats for pyjamas to support The Pyjama Foundation's 2011 Pyjama Drive for kids in foster care.

McNab CEO Mark Adamson said the Pyjama Drive was a great way to help make a difference to the lives of families and children in foster care.

"Some children go into foster care with nothing and while pyjamas are such an everyday occurrence for many of us, for these children it can make a real difference," Mr Adamson said.

McNab acted as a community collection point in Toowoomba, Brisbane and Townsville for the National Pyjama Drive week from the 1-31 March.

Aside from raising monetary funds for literary resources, almost 80 pairs of new pyjamas were donated by staff.
