St Joseph's College commemorate construction of new library

Bishop William Morris has helped St. Joseph's College commemorate the construction of new library facilities by conducting a Sod Turning Ceremony today.

The \$3.5 million building to be built by McNab will consist of a large library, seven classrooms, parking and state-of-the-art IT facilities.

Bishop Morris reinforced the importance of providing sufficient resources for the school's growing numbers.

"Students need the proper infrastructure in order to achieve to the best of their ability," Bishop Morris said.

"It's a great day for the school diocese."

St Joseph's College Principal Dan McMahon agreed and said the new facilities would be better suited to the school's growing population.

"After twenty years, we have outgrown our current library so the new facilities will provide more teaching area, more learning capacity and more space," Mr McMahon said.

"It's a wonderful resource to encourage students to be life-long learners."

Mr McMahon said the school aimed to raise the money required for the building without government assistance.

"Fundraising is hard work but we're confident that the parent and local community will support us in sustaining the debt."

McNab Regional General Manager Danny Rowe said the project would greatly benefit the school community and provide a platform for future growth and development.

"McNab are proud to be associated with St Joseph's and Brammer Architects in the construction of the new learning facilities," Mr Rowe said.
